Purpose of Job

We're looking for a friendly, practical, hands-on Fixery Workshop Officer. If you love problem-solving, enjoy working with people, and care about reducing waste and sustainable consumption, this is the role for you.

The Fixery Workshop Officer supports the daily operations of the Fixery, helping to deliver a welcoming, community-centred service that promotes repair, reuse and waste reduction. The role involves working alongside volunteers and community members to create an inviting space where people want to spend time, while enabling residents to access circular activities through managing the Fixery stalls and ensuring a smooth running of the hub's operations.

This role would suit someone passionate about sustainability or looking to pursue a career in sustainability and looking for a step in the door. We'll support you to develop new skills while helping your community keep valuable items in use and out of landfill. If you're curious, adaptable, and keen to learn, we'd love to hear from you.

Key Responsibilities and Tasks

1. Welcoming people into the space, explaining how the repair process works, and creating a friendly, inclusive atmosphere.
2. Operating stalls and services within the Fixery, including transactions.
3. Logging repair data and capturing the impact of the items we save from landfill.
4. Supporting community events, workshops, and outreach activities.

Other requirements

Weekend work is a central part of this role. The Fixery will be open from Thursday to Sunday inclusive. We are prepared to consider flexible working arrangements – so if you might be able to work Thursday and Friday only, or Saturday and Sunday only, we're happy to consider such requests in application and at interview.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities

Activity and delivery

- Manage the effective running of the Fixery operations and provide support to collaborators and volunteers operating from the site.
- Work with the Fixery team and management to make changes in response to feedback and project needs.
- Participate in the necessary training needed for the role.
- Take responsibility for ensuring health and safety, safeguarding, and first aid protocols are implemented and adhered to at the site at all times.
- Ensure activities provide an inclusive and pleasant environment for staff, volunteers, and members of the public.
- Implement processes to manage the inventory of equipment, consumables, spares, and repaired items at the Fixery.

Volunteer management

- Help build a volunteer community that feels empowered to take the lead on the delivery of some of the core Fixery activities.
- Create an open, welcoming, inclusive environment for volunteers, whilst encouraging collaboration and skill sharing.

Relationship management

- Build and maintain positive relationships with local stakeholders, including the managers and users, members of the public, local repair businesses, volunteers, and community fixing initiatives, with support from the Fixery team and management.
- Maintain an open and honest line of communication with the Fixery team and management.

Monitoring and evaluation

- Collect monitoring and evaluation data related to the Fixery to inform project operations.

Income generation

- Work with the Fixery team to track and grow onsite income-generating activities to ensure that the shop meets its objectives for financial sustainability.

Finance management

- Follow agreed Fixery finance processes, including correct and timely categorisation of regular project income and expenditure (training will be provided) with support from the team and management as needed.

Organisational and partner involvement

- Be a team player: skill sharing, chipping in on communal tasks, and helping each other out.
